Featured Programs:

"Community Educational Program" - Maasai Girls Educational Fund

DFW will support Community Education Program workshops throughout Maasai communities that address age-old ethnic customs and beliefs contributing to early marriage, teen pregnancy, the spread of HIV, female genital cutting, and violence against women, all of which prevent girls from receiving an education and perpetuate poverty among the Maasai people. This program also includes business training workshops for rural Maasai women that will prepare them to become self-sufficient. **Goal:** \$23,504

"Dreams for our Daughters" - Huru International

DFW will support Huru kits to be distributed to 1,625 at-risk adolescent girls through peer-led educational workshops, which will also focus on HIV prevention, sexual and reproductive health, and menstrual hygiene education. **Goal:** \$21,990

Transitions Global's mission is to empower survivors of sex trafficking, with the opportunity to heal and recapture the most basic of human rights - freedom and hope. DFW will support the Transitions' Dream Home and STAR House programs, which will serve 28 young Cambodian and Vietnamese teenage girls rescued from sex trafficking. Through a three-phased progressive program these women will be cared for and empowered to pursue new dreams for their future.
