
# Introducing The Pangea Network

# About Kenya

- Population is nearly 56 million
- Dramatic population growth due to high birth rate and declining mortality rate
- More than 40 percent of Kenyans are under age 15
- Agriculture is backbone of economy
- Drought conditions have led to high food insecurity



# Life Challenges for Women in Kenya

- Higher rates of poverty
- Lack equal access to a comprehensive education
- Unaware of their legal rights
- Lower rates of land ownership
- Limited access to reproductive health education and services



# The Project: Kenyan Women's Network (KWN) Training of Trainers

- Provides training and small business revolving funds to women living in extreme poverty
- Leads to better health, rights awareness, more decision-making power, greater earning potential. and a dignified standard of living.
- 15 women will complete an extensive training process to become paid trainers to women in their communities
- Cooperatives will be selected, and the new trainers will take 350 women through the six-month training program

# The Project: Benefits

Participants will increase

- knowledge of critical-life skills through training in human rights, leadership, and personal development
- livelihood knowledge and skills through training in business skills and bookkeeping
- overall health and nutrition levels through training in personal hygiene, basic nutrition, and reproductive health

# About The Pangea Network

- Founded in 2005 by Nicole Minor
- Began its first Kenyan Women's Network (KWN) program in 2007
- KWN has now reached over 1,400 women in multiple areas of Kenya
- In 2009, established office in Nairobi, began the Student Sponsorship Program, and began focusing all international efforts in Kenya
- In 2021, started major effort to expand reproductive health education to adolescent girls in Kenya
