The project is designed to provide financial support to educate girls through high school by offering full scholarships. 32 girls will benefit from an annual scholarship of \$700 per student and \$2600 will go into administrative costs.

The end of primary school national examinations are administered in October/November of every year in East African schools. The results of the examinations come out by Christmas. It is at this point that our coordinators on the ground start the process of identifying and vetting applicants to the GTL scholarships, a process that takes time and effort. The girls need to have done well to qualify and must show need for financial support. With over 50% of the population in the 3 countries of Kenya, Uganda and Tanzania living below the poverty line, as stated by the UN, the need for scholarships is really high. High school public education is not free in East Africa.

The 32 scholarships offered in 2024 by TWR, are part of the 448 in total that GTL is paying for this year. There are no significant changes in the management, governance or funding of GTL. All the 32 girls supported by TWR are in school, and they started in January 2024.

When we offer a scholarship to a GTL scholar, we make a commitment to pay for their school fees for 4 to 6 years, until they complete high school as long as they keep their grades up. The biggest challenge we encounter is that we have to look for money year in and year out to meet this commitment. We have wonderful foundation donors who make generous donations to us, and we continue to look for new donors. We also have a reserve fund that will kick in when our main funder can longer support us, and we shall not recruit new scholars then, only make sure that the ones already in the pipeline can finish and graduate.

We have paid out \$22,400 to the 4 schools for the fees. The remaining \$2600 has gone to pay for transport costs, accommodation and fees for Mercy and Ivy to visit the new girls, take photos and edit the video for this report.

We also paid for the travel and accommodation costs for the Executive Director to visit the school and girls in Tanzania.
