## Adelante Foundation **HONDURAS**

This project will equip low-income women in Honduras with subsidized microloans and practical financial training to grow small businesses and strengthen household stability. Over 12 months, women will receive loans, financial education, and follow-up support to build savings, expand enterprises, and improve family well-being.

## Freely in Hope **KENYA**

Freely in Hope's "Pendo's Power" program will help prevent sexual violence by equipping girls ages 4-12, their caregivers, and educators with tools to recognize and respond to abuse. Survivor-led workshops use storytelling, play, and music to make protection skills engaging, safe, and lasting.

## CAMFED **ZAMBIA**

CAMFED's Transition Program supports vulnerable young women in rural Zambia as they move from school to employment or entrepreneurship. Peer mentors will train graduates in health, finance, and business skills, helping them launch livelihoods and lead change in their communities.

## Imagine Her **UGANDA**

Imagine Her's Green Energy Lab will train out-of-school young women in renewable energy, agribusiness, and entrepreneurship to expand income and climate resilience. The program provides technical skills, mentorship, and start-up capital to help women launch sustainable, women-led green enterprises.

## Global Pediatric Alliance **MEXICO**

This project will provide training for Indigenous midwives, health providers, and women leaders that blends ancestral wisdom with modern, rights-based medical practices in order to reduce maternal and infant mortality.

## dZi Foundation **NEPAL**

The MaUKa Initiative will empower women farmers in rural Nepal with financial literacy, business training, and market access to start and grow agri-enterprises. The program helps families increase income and food security.

## KGSA Foundation **KENYA**

Kibera Girls School Soccer Academy (KGSA) Foundation will strengthen academic performance, data systems, and local fundraising to improve education for girls in Kenya. The project enhances teacher training in STEM, tracks student success, and builds long-term financial sustainability for the school.

## One Day's Wages **AFGHANISTAN**

This project will expand access to maternal health care in Afghanistan by training midwives and supporting a midwife-led clinic in Kabul. Together, these efforts will improve birth outcomes and ensure safe, dignified care for women regardless of income.

## Creamos Norte **GUATEMALA**

Creamos Norte will deliver community-based mental health services for women in Guatemala City's most marginalized neighborhoods. Through individual therapy, support groups, and childcare, survivors of violence gain tools for healing and emotional resilience.

## Girls Gotta Run **ETHIOPIA**

Girls Gotta Run will empower girls in Ethiopia through education, health support, and athletics while helping their mothers gain financial stability. The program keeps girls in school, delays early marriage, and builds stronger families through mentorship and savings groups.

## Amal **MOROCCO**

Amal's 10-month culinary training program offers women from disadvantaged backgrounds professional cooking instruction, stipends, and wraparound support to achieve financial independence. Graduates join an active alumni network with a 92% job placement rate.

## Rukundo International **UGANDA**

Rukundo International will empower mothers of girls in its education program with goats, business training, microloans, and psychosocial support. This cooperative model links women's income generation directly to girls' education and family stability.
